

Bible Study from “The Word of God series”

Christ – Word become flesh

Read: **John 1:14-15,**

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

1. What does it mean for the Word of God to become flesh?

Read: **Col. 1:19-20**

“For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him **to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross.**”

2. Why was it important that Christ led a sinless life?

Read: **John 1:16-18,**

“Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.”

3. How is the grace of Christ different from the grace of Old Testament law?
4. In what way is Christ the Truth?

Read: **Romans 6:5**

“For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his.”

5. Why is Christ’s resurrection important?

Read: **Romans 6:11-14**

“In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. Do not offer any part of yourself to sin as an instrument of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer every part of yourself to him as an instrument of righteousness. For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the law, but under grace.”
